Many countries have had a one-party rule, but India is unique in its democratic conditions. Even though many parties ran in free and fair elections, Congress managed to win election after election. Between 1885 and 1905 Indian National Congress in its annual sessions passed several resolutions. These resolutions as well as humble demands made

by Congress included administrative, economic and constitutional policies and civil rights. Many factors are responsible for Congress Dominance.

- The Congress party was seen as the Inheritor of the national movement.
- Many of the figures who had been at the forefront of the campaign were now running for Congress.
- The Congress was already a well-organized party, and the Congress dominance had already begun its campaign before the other parties could even think of a strategy.
- Several political parties were created just around or after the country's independence. As a result, Congress enjoyed the benefit of being "first off the blocks".

- The party had not only spread across the length and breadth of the country by the time of independence but also had an organizational network down to the local level.
- Most crucially, because Congress dominance was a national movement until recently, it was all inclusive.

Congress grew from a pressure organization for newly educated, professional, and commercial classes in 1885 to a mass movement in the twentieth century. This provided the groundwork for the party's eventual metamorphosis into a large political party and subsequent political dominance. It originated as an English-speaking upper caste upper-middle-class, and urban elite-dominated party. Its social base widened with each civil disobedience movement it organized. As a result, it brought together disparate groups with opposing viewpoints. Its leadership gradually shifted from upper caste and upper-class professionals to agriculture based leaders with a rural focus.
